Each member of the County Council shall hold office for a term of four years commencing on the first Monday in December following election, or as soon thereafter as practicable, and shall enter upon the duties of the office immediately upon qualification and serve until a successor shall qualify. No person elected or appointed to the office of County Councilmember shall be eligible to succeed himself or herself in the office if he or she has served in the office for [two] THREE full consecutive four-year terms [at or after January 1, 1994].
