1	AN ORDINANCE concerning: Pension – General Provisions
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3	FOR the purpose of adding a provision to pension administration to limit the recovery by the
4	Personnel Officer or their agents of pension system overpayments in certain
5	circumstances; and generally relating to pensions.
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7	BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: § 5-1-104
8	Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)
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10	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,
11	That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:
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13	ARTICLE 5 PENSION
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15	TITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS
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17	5-1-104. Administration by Personnel Officer.
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19	(a) Generally. Each plan shall be administered by the Personnel Officer. In matters
20	relating to the administration of each plan, the Personnel Officer may seek the advice and
21	guidance of the Board.
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23	(b) Powers. The Personnel Officer has the powers necessary for proper administration of
24	each plan, including the powers to prepare forms and prescribe procedures to be used and
25	followed by participants in filing applications for benefits and for furnishing of evidence

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necessary to establish a right to benefits; make determinations as to the rights of participants applying for or receiving benefits; develop procedures for determining credited service of participants, including affording participants an opportunity after written notice to make objection to the determination in advance of retirement; authorize disbursements from each pension fund in accordance with the plan and establish necessary procedures for authorizing disbursements; audit and review past benefit determinations and initiate recovery of any overpayments; establish policies and standards and make determinations concerning total and permanent disability for the purposes of this article; withhold funds for making payment of taxes and for making payments under qualified domestic relations orders; and, at the Personnel Officer's discretion, withhold funds authorized by a participant.

(C) Limitation on recovery of overpayments. IN THE ABSENCE OF FRAUD BY A PARTICIPANT, THE PERSONNEL OFFICER OR THEIR AGENTS OR ASSIGNS MAY NOT RECOVER AN OVERPAYMENT BASED ON AN ERRONEOUS PAST BENEFIT DETERMINATION IF THE PARTICIPANT MADE A MATERIAL CHANGE IN POSITION, INCLUDING ACCEPTING, RESIGNING OR RETIRING FROM EMPLOYMENT, IN REASONABLE RELIANCE UPON AN INTENTIONAL OR NEGLIGENT MISREPRESENTATION OF THE AMOUNT OF THE PARTICIPANT'S BENEFIT MADE TO THE PARTICIPANT BY THE PERSONNEL OFFICER OR AN EMPLOYEE OR OTHER AGENT OF THE PERSONNEL OFFICER.

SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to any overpayment not recovered by the Personnel Officer on or before April 15, 2013.

SECTION 3. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
