## A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN ORDINANCE concerning: Crimes, Civil Offenses, and Fines – Crimes – Littering
2	<i>8 </i>
3	FOR the purpose of adding a definition of "litter"; prohibiting littering; establishing
4	sanctions for violations; and generally relating to crimes, civil offenses, and fines.

6	BY renumbering: §§ 9-1-703 through 9-1-711, respectively, to be §§ 9-1-704 through 9-1-
7	712, respectively
8	Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)

10	BY adding: § 9-1-703
11	Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)

13	WHEREAS, trash is one of the most pervasive and visible pollutants in Anne
14	Arundel County; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, litter causes a range of economic and environmental problems, from
17	reducing property values to killing wildlife and releasing a number of harmful
18	chemicals and byproducts into our environment and waterways; and

20	WHEREAS, in 2020 the Maryland General Assembly passed House Bill 77 and
21	Senate Bill 60 authorizing the governing body of Anne Arundel County to adopt an
22	ordinance to prohibit littering and impose criminal and civil penalties for violations;

1 WHEREAS, giving Anne Arundel County the power to combat littering would be a significant step towards protecting Anne Arundel County and making it the best 2 3 place; now, therefore 4 SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, 5 That §§ 9-1-703 through 9-1-711, respectively, of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, 6 as amended) are hereby renumbered to be §§ 9-1-704 through 9-1-712, respectively. 7 8 SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County 9 Code (2005, as amended) read as follows: 10 11 **ARTICLE 9. CRIMES, CIVIL OFFENSES, AND FINES** 12 13 **TITLE 1. CRIMES** 14 15 16 9-1-703. Littering. 17 (A) Definition. IN THIS SECTION, "LITTER" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 10-110 OF 18 THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE OF THE STATE CODE. 19 20 21 (B) **Prohibitions**. A PERSON MAY NOT: 22 23 (1) DISPOSE OF LITTER ON A COUNTY ROAD OR VIOLATE STATE VEHICLE LAWS 24 REGARDING THE DISPOSAL OF LITTER, GLASS, OR OTHER PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES ON 25 ROADS; OR 26 27 (2) DISPOSE OF OR CAUSE TO ALLOW THE DISPOSAL OF LITTER ON PUBLIC OR 28 PRIVATE PROPERTY UNLESS: 29 30 (I) THE PROPERTY IS DESIGNATED BY THE STATE, A UNIT OF THE STATE, OR A 31 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE FOR THE DISPOSAL OF LITTER AND THE PERSON IS 32 AUTHORIZED BY THE PROPER PUBLIC AUTHORITY TO USE THE PROPERTY; OR 33 (II) THE LITTER IS PLACED INTO A GARBAGE OR SOLID WASTE RECEPTACLE OR 34 CONTAINER ON THE PROPERTY. 35 36 37 (C) Violations. A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT 38 TO: 39 40 (1) A CIVIL FINE FOR A CLASS D CIVIL OFFENSE; OR 41 42 (2) THE PENALTIES SET FORTH IN § 10-110 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE OF THE 43 STATE CODE. 44 SECTION 3. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days 45

46 from the date it becomes law.
