4 C1 commercial districts; and generally relating to zoning.

9 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,*
10 That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

13 TITLE 5. COMMERCIAL DISTRICTS

16 **18-5-102. Permitted, conditional, special exception, and business complex auxiliary**
17 **uses.**

19 The permitted, conditional, and special exception uses allowed in each of the
20 commercial districts, and uses auxiliary to a business complex, are listed in the chart in this
21 section using the following key: P = permitted use; C = conditional use; SE = special
22 exception use; and A = auxiliary to a business complex use. A blank means that the use is
23 not allowed in the district. Except as provided otherwise in this article, uses and structures
24 customarily accessory to permitted, conditional, and special exception uses also are
25 allowed.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate new matter added to existing law.
[Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.
Captions and taglines in **bold** in this bill are catchwords and are not law.
Asterisks *** indicate existing Code provisions in a list or chart that remain unchanged.



SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.


