1	AN ORDINANCE concerning: General Provisions – Civil Emergencies

3	FOR the purpose of prohibiting the County from enforcing conditions imposed in
4	connection with the proclamation of an emergency that are more restrictive than
5	conditions imposed by the State in connection with a proclamation of emergency unless
6	authorized by ordinance adopted by the affirmative vote of five members of the County
7	Council; and generally relating to civil emergencies.

12	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,
13	That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

15	ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

17	TITLE 6. CIVIL EMERGENCIES

19	1-6-104. Duration.

21	(A) In general. A proclamation of a civil emergency or an executive order may not be
22	effective for more than seven days unless authorized by ordinance enacted by the County
23	Council.

25 26	(B) Prohibition against certain conditions. IF THE GOVERNOR HAS ALSO PROCLAIMED THE EXISTENCE OF AN EMERGENCY AND, IF THE GOVERNOR LIFTS OR

MODIFIES ANY CONDITION ADOPTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROCLAMATION, THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE, ACTING UNDER THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S EMERGENCY POWERS, MAY NOT ADOPT ANY CONDITION THAT IS MORE RESTRICTIVE THAN ANY CONDITION ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNOR, UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY ORDINANCE ENACTED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF FIVE MEMBERS OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL.

SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
