5	Fund to 10% of the estimated General Fund revenues for the upcoming fiscal year;

12	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,

21	(b) Appropriation. The budget as proposed by the County Executive and approved by
22	the County Council may contain an appropriation to fund the Revenue Reserve
23	Fund except that the amount of the annual appropriation to the Revenue Reserve Fund may
24	not cause the sum of the balance of the Revenue Reserve Fund plus the appropriation to

(c) **Interest earnings.** Interest earnings of the fund shall be retained to the credit of the fund except that the Controller may credit interest earnings of the Revenue Reserve Fund to the General Fund if credited interest earnings cause the total amount of the fund to exceed an amount equal to [[5%]] 10% of the estimated General Fund revenues for the upcoming fiscal year.

SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, welfare, and property, and being passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, the same shall take effect from the date it becomes law.
