3	FOR the purpose of enacting a reorganization ordinance authorizing the County Executive to
4	allocate supervisory authority over the heads of the offices, departments, and units within
5	the Executive Branch of County government between the Chief Administrative Officer
6	and the Chief of Staff as the County Executive deems appropriate; changing the duties
7	and responsibilities of the position of Chief of Staff; and generally relating to the

13	WHEREAS, the organizational structure of the Executive Branch of County
14	government is and has for a number of years been inconsistent with the organization
15	described in Title 1 of Article 2 of the County Code; and

17	WHEREAS, Section 503 of the County Charter confers upon the County Council the
18	authority to enact a "reorganization ordinance" upon the recommendation of the
19	County Executive changing the organization structure and supervisory responsibilities

21	WHEREAS, the County Executive has recommended that, in lieu of the "Core

given the power to allocate and assign supervisory authority over the heads of the offices, departments, and units within the Executive Branch of County government between the Chief Administrative Officer and the Chief of Staff as the County Executive deems appropriate; now, therefore

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

ARTICLE 2 BRANCHES OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

TITLE 1. EXECUTIVE BRANCH

2-1-202. Chief of Staff.

(a) **Head of Executive Office.** The head of the Executive Office is the Chief of Staff who is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the County Executive. The Chief of Staff reports directly to the County Executive.

(b) **Duties.** The Chief of Staff shall assist the County Executive in formulating policy, coordinate matters between the County Executive and the County Council, manage special projects as assigned by the County Executive, and exercise other authority and perform other duties, responsibilities, and functions as determined by the County Executive. The County Executive may assign to the Chief of Staff any or all of the authority, duties, responsibilities, and functions prescribed in the Charter for the Secretary to the County Executive AND SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OVER EXECUTIVE BRANCH OFFICES, DEPARTMENTS, AND UNITS NOT ASSIGNED TO THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER.

SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
