21	(a) Licenses generally. A County resident who is not a dog fancier, cat fancier, or		
2	commercial kennel owner shall have and maintain a license under this subsection for		

each dog or cat owned.

(4) The fee for each license established in this subsection is set forth in the following charts.

12-4-912. Adopted animals – spaying or neutering fees; waiver of fees.

(a) Scope. This section does not apply to animals purchased from pet shops, commercial kennels, or other commercial establishments.

(b) Conditions for adoption. An animal may not be adopted from an animal control facility except on:

(2) execution of any adoption contract established by the Chief; AND

(1) approval by the Chief at the Chief's discretion;

> (3) provision for spaying or neutering of the animal as provided in subsection (c)[; and

(4) payment of a fee of: 1 2 3 (i) \$25 for male dogs and puppies; 4 5 (ii) \$40 for female dogs and puppies; 6 (iii) \$10 for male cats and kittens; and 7 8 (iv) \$20 for female cats and kittens]. 9 10 11 (c) Spaying and neutering. Each animal adopted from an animal control facility or a private, nonprofit animal shelter operated by a humane society or association shall be 12 spayed or neutered: 13 14 (1) by a licensed veterinarian at the expense of the adopter within 30 days of 15 adoption or such other date as specified in the adoption agreement under the authority of 16 17 the Chief or the shelter operator; or 18 19 (2) if the animal is adopted from an animal control facility, as provided for by the Chief before the adoption. 20 21 22 (d) Expenses. If the adopter provides for the spaying or neutering of the animal 23 under subsection (c)(1), the adopter shall provide evidence of the spaying or neutering as required by the Police Department or the shelter operator [and, if the adoption was from 24 25 an animal control facility, the Police Department shall refund the adoption fee on receipt of the evidence. If the Chief provides for the spaying or neutering of the animal under 26 27 subsection (c)(2), the adopter shall reimburse the Agency for the cost of the spaying or neutering that is in excess of the adoption fee established under subsection (b)(4). 28 29 30 (e) Waiver of adoption fees. At the discretion of the Chief or the Chief's designee. Animal Control may waive some or all adoption fees, including, but not limited to, any 31 fees listed in subsection (b)(4) and any expenses included in subsection (d). The length of 32 33 time that a fee waiver applies shall be determined by the Chief's designee 34 and may be initiated or suspended at any time. The Chief or the Chief's designee shall waive adoption fees for the placement of an animal with a private, nonprofit animal 35 shelter or rescue organization]. 36 37 38 SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days
