A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning: Zoning – Nurseries with Landscaping and Plant Sales

2
3 FOR the purpose of amending the definition of “nurseries with landscaping and plant
4 sales”; removing a limit on the percentage of a lot that can be used for accessory retail
5 or wholesale uses; adding a conditional use requirement for “nurseries with landscaping
6 and plant sales” to allow the storage and display of certain materials on a portion of the
7 lot; making a facility in use as of a certain date a lawful use under certain conditions;
8 making the effective date of certain parts of this Ordinance contingent on the approval
9 of the Maryland Critical Area Commission; and generally relating to zoning.

15 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,*
16 That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

20 **TITLE 1. DEFINITIONS**

1 **18-1-101. Definitions.**

2
3 Unless defined in this article, the Natural Resources Article of the State Code, or
4 COMAR, words defined elsewhere in this Code apply in this article. The following words
5 have the meanings indicated:

7 (90) “Nurseries with landscaping and plant sales” means a facility for the
8 cultivating, harvesting, and sale of plants, bushes, trees, and other nursery items grown
9 onsite, ~~[[or established]]~~ EITHER in the ground OR IN CONTAINERS, prior to sale, AND
10 INCLUDES THE SALE OF PRODUCTS RELATED TO LANDSCAPING AND THE CULTIVATION
11 OF PLANTS, BUSHES, TREES, AND OTHER NURSERY ITEMS.

13 **TITLE 10. REQUIREMENTS FOR CONDITIONAL USES**

14
15 ~~18-10-138~~ **18-10-139. Nurseries with landscaping and plant sales.**

16
17 A nursery with landscaping and plant sales shall comply with all of the following
18 requirements.

19
20 (1) The facility shall be located on a lot of at least 5 acres.

21
22 (2) The facility shall be located on an arterial or collector road.

23
24 (3) Accessory retail or wholesale uses ~~[[may not occupy more than 1% of the lot,~~
25 but a retail or wholesale use does not include green houses and required setbacks, growing
26 areas, or plant display areas]] ARE PERMITTED.

27
28 (4) Any accessory landscaping or tree cutting operations may not occupy more than
29 15% of the lot, excluding required setbacks.

31 (5) ~~THE STORAGE AND DISPLAY AREAS FOR MATERIALS AND PRODUCTS USED AND~~
32 ~~SOLD FOR LANDSCAPING AND THE CULTIVATION OF PLANTS, BUSHES, TREES, AND OTHER~~
33 ~~NURSERY ITEMS, SUCH AS STONE, MULCH, OR FERTILIZER, MAY NOT OCCUPY MORE THAN~~
34 ~~30% OF THE LOT, OR ONE ACRE, WHICHEVER IS LESS.~~

36 ~~[[5]]~~ (6) A conditional use granted under this section and in use as of April 7, 2014
37 shall be ~~[[governed by the law in effect as of that date]]~~ A LAWFUL USE IF LOCATED ON A
38 LOT OF AT LEAST FIVE ACRES IN A R2 ZONING DISTRICT, OR ON A LOT OF AT LEAST TWO
39 ACRES IN ALL OTHER ZONING DISTRICTS, AND IF THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTIONS (2)
40 THROUGH (5) ARE MET.

42 ~~SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days~~
43 ~~from the date it becomes law.~~

45 SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That, for nurseries with landscaping and plant
46 sales located in the resource conservation area (RCA) of the critical area, Section 1 of this
47 Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law, or upon approval of the
48 Maryland Critical Area Commission under the authority granted by § 8-1801 et. seq. of the
49 Natural Resources Article of the State Code, whichever is later. If approved, in whole or
50 in part, after the 45 days, the approved provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance shall take


1 effect for nurseries with landscaping and plant sales located in the RCA of the critical area
2 on the date the notice of approval is received by the Office of Planning and Zoning. If
3 disapproved, in whole or in part, nurseries with landscaping and plant sales located in the
4 RCA of the critical area shall be governed by the law as it existed before the effective date
5 of Bill 57-22, without the necessity of further action by the County Council. The Office of
6 Planning and Zoning, within five days after receiving any notice from the Maryland
7 Critical Area Commission, shall forward a copy to the Administrative Officer to the County
8 Council.

9
10 SECTION 3. *And be it further enacted,* That, for nurseries with landscaping and plants
11 sales not subject to Section 2 of this Ordinance, Section 1 of this Ordinance shall take effect
12 45 days from the date it becomes law.
