10 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County,*
11 *Maryland,* That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as

10 **18-11-151. Self-service storage facilities.**
 11

12 A self-service storage facility shall comply with all of the following requirements.

- 14 (1) The facility shall be located on a lot of at least [two] FOUR acres.
- 15
- 16 (2) Storage and a residence for a caretaker or resident manager shall be the only
 17 activities conducted at the facility.
- 18
- 19 (3) Access shall be provided as follows:
- 20
- 21 (i) Each one-way interior driveway shall have a travel lane at least 15 feet
 22 wide.
- 23
- 24 (ii) Each two-way interior driveway shall have two travel lanes, each at least
 25 12 feet wide.
- 26
- 27 (iii) Traffic direction and parking shall be designated by directional signs or
 28 pavement painting.
- 29
- 30 (4) Outside storage is not permitted.
- 31
- 32 [(5) In a C2 district, a self-service storage facility shall be within an enclosed
 33 controlled central structure with no external access to individual storage units.]

35 SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days
 36 from the date it becomes law.

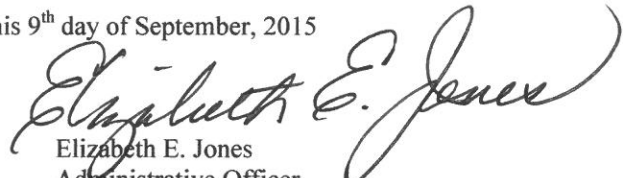

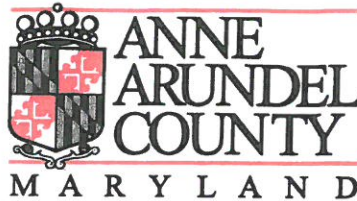

Re: **Veto of Bill 63-15: Zoning – Self-Storage Facilities**

Dear Members of the Council:

Pursuant to Section 307(j) of the County Charter, I have vetoed the enclosed Bill 63-15 that was passed by the Council on September 8, 2015. Bill 63-15 would remove self-service storage facilities as a special exception use in areas zoned C2 in the County. In addition, it would require these facilities to be located on four acres instead of the two acres that are currently required.

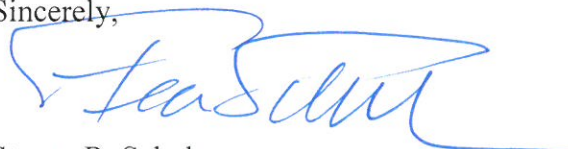
On May 4, 2015 the County Council unanimously passed Bill 21-15 that I requested be introduced to increase the areas in the County where self-service storage facilities could locate. These increased opportunities included areas zoned as C2, which is understood as an area that allows offices and other light commercial and institutional uses. A self-service storage facility is a light commercial use and a completely appropriate and desirable use in C2. Bill 63-15 would reverse this action by the Council, and I opposed this bill at each hearing before the Council.

Bill 63-15 would limit the opportunity for new self-service storage facility operators to open a business while insulating existing operators from outside competition. This legislation would allow existing facilities to dominate the market by increasing the required acreage and eliminating C2 areas that currently permit self-service storage facilities. These road blocks hurt small businesses that are looking to expand in or enter the County. In addition, this bill would inconvenience consumers in our County who need facilities close to their homes and businesses. Finally, with fewer acceptable locations for these facilities, rental prices will inevitably rise as demand outpaces supply in the storage facility market. Current law, which this Council and my administration created together with Bill 21-15, allows for more choices and lower prices for consumers within this County.

For the above reasons, I have now vetoed Bill 63-15. I look forward to working with you to make Anne Arundel County the best place to live, work, and start a business.
