LOWER, AS DESCRIBED IN THE COUNTY DESIGN MANUAL, AND UNLESS THERE IS NO
ALTERNATIVE ACCESS.
SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days
from the date it becomes law.
