## A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN ORDINANCE concerning: Zoning - Outdoor Lighting in Nonresidential and
2	Residential Zoning Districts
3	
4	FOR the purpose of providing for the applicability of outdoor lighting provisions; adding
5	the conditions for the installation of outdoor light fixtures on residentially zoned lots;
6	making conforming changes; and generally relating to zoning.

8	BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: § 18-3-201
9	Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)

11	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,
12	That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:
13	
14	ARTICLE 18. ZONING
15	
16	TITLE 3. PARKING, OUTDOOR LIGHTING, AND SIGNAGE
17	
18	18-3-201. Outdoor lighting.
19	
20	(A) Applicability. This section does not apply to light fixtures on public
21	STREETS OR RIGHTS-OF-WAY.

[[(a)]] (B) Outdoor lighting in nonresidential zoning districts. [[Except as provided 1 in subsection (b), outdoor]] OUTDOOR light fixtures in nonresidential zoning districts shall 2 be located at least 25 feet from the boundary of any residential district, [[. 3 4 (b) Exceptions. The EXCEPT THAT THE Office of Planning and Zoning may approve 5 a lesser setback [[than is required by subsection (a)]] upon the filing of an application that 6 describes the type, location, lumen rating, and height of an outdoor lighting fixture and the 7 reasons why a lesser setback should be allowed. Potential reasons for a lesser setback may 8 include the following: 9 10 (1) fixtures will not be visible at any point along the boundaries of the lot on which 11 they are located due to the location of buildings or walls, topography, or similar visual 12 barriers: 13 14 (2) lighting will have minimal offsite impact due to the distance of the fixtures from 15 roads and neighboring properties; 16 17 (3) fixtures will incorporate additional shielding or other features to prevent offsite 18 impact; or 19 20 (4) lighting plans demonstrate other factors that will prevent glare and light 21 spillover. 22 23 (C) Outdoor lighting in residential zoning districts. OUTDOOR LIGHT FIXTURES 24 25 INSTALLED ON A RESIDENTIALLY ZONED LOT SHALL BE: 26 27 (1) ARRANGED TO DIRECT THE LIGHT DOWN TOWARDS THE PROPERTY ON WHICH 28 THE LIGHT FIXURE FIXTURE IS LOCATED AND AWAY FROM ADJOINING RESIDENTIAL LOTS 29 OR AIMED TO CONFINE THE LIGHT TO AN OBJECT, SUCH AS A FLAG OR LANDSCAPING; AND 30 (2) INSTALLED USING MOTION SENSING IF USED FOR SECURITY PURPOSES. 31 32 33 SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days
