Eligibility 10 (a) Fire Service Retirement Plan. [Except as provided in subsection (b), a] A participant 11 12 in the Fire Service Retirement Plan is eligible to participate in the DROP if the participant is actively employed by the County in a position covered by the plan and has completed 20 years 13 of actual plan service. 14 15 (b) Fire Service Retirement Plan after January 1, 2015. After January 1, 2015, an 16 employee in the classification of Fire Battalion Chief will not be eligible to participate in 17 DROP. 18 19 (c)] (B) Police Service Retirement Plan. FOR PARTICIPANTS WHO ARE EMPLOYEES REPRESENTED BY THE INTERNATIONAL 27 ASSOCIATION OF FIREFIGHTERS, LOCAL 1563 [The] THE DROP participation period may be 28 extended by no more than [two] THREE additional one-year terms, AND THE DROP 29 PARTICIPATION PERIOD MAY BE EXTENDED BY NO MORE THAN THREE ADDITIONAL ONE-30 YEAR TERMS FOR ALL OTHER PARTICIPANTS WHO QUALIFY FOR PARTICIPATION IN DROP 31 UNDER § 5-1-503. RE: Veto and Veto Statement, Bill No. 56-13

Dear Members of the County Council:

In accordance with Section 307(j) of the Anne Arundel County Charter, I hereby exercise my Executive Veto as to Bill No. 56-13. My reasons for not approving the Bill are stated below and are incorporated by reference to the bill, which is returned to you.

I have vetoed Bill No. 56-13, Ordinance concerning: County Pension and Retirement Plans because it provides a benefit, a sixth year in the DROP, for employees represented by the International Association of Firefighters, Local 1563, which was not part of its collective bargaining agreement. Attempting to add a provision that was not part of the collective bargaining agreement undermines the union negotiation process.

I will re-introduce Bill 56-13 to the County Council as it was originally written to allow the other four public safety unions that collectively bargained and came to good faith agreements with the Administration to expand their eligibility in the DROP to a sixth year.
