1	RESOLUTION supporting the reinstitution and funding of the Police Cadet Program
2	operated by the Anne Arundel County Police Department

4	WHEREAS, in past years the Anne Arundel County Police Department ran a Police
5	Cadet Program for young men and women between the ages of 18 and 21 years who
6	were interested in exploring the possibility of a career in law enforcement; and

8	WHEREAS, not only did the Police Cadet Program serve a valuable role in attracting
9	local young men and women as potential candidates to become Anne Arundel
10	County police officers, the Cadets provided important services to the Police
11	Department that enhanced the ability of sworn officers to protect and preserve public
12	safety; and
13	WHIEDEAS the Delice Codet Dreamen was disceptioned during the according
14 15	WHEREAS, the Police Cadet Program was discontinued during the economic downturn causing a loss of its important contributions to the interests of the County
16	and its citizens; and

18	WHEREAS, a funding transfer to the Anne Arundel County Police Department of
19	\$180,000 is required to reinstitute the program with ten cadets, an investment in the
20	future of the County that the County Council believes is highly worthwhile; now,
21	therefore, be it

23	Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That the County
24	Council hereby requests that the Anne Arundel County Police Cadet program be reinstituted
25	and urges the County Executive to initiate the action necessary to transfer \$180,000 to the
26	budget of the Anne Arundel County Police Department in order to fund ten Police Cadets for
27	the remainder of the fiscal year; and be it further
