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ARTICLE 18. ZONING

TITLE 1. DEFINITIONS

18-1-101. Definitions.

 Unless defined in this article, the Natural Resources Article of the State Code, or COMAR, words defined elsewhere in this Code apply in this article. The following words have the meanings indicated:

(45) "GARDEN CENTER" MEANS A FACILITY THAT SELLS PLANTS, BUSHES OR TREES, GROWN ONSITE OR OFFSITE, AS WELL AS OTHER ITEMS CUSTOMARILY USED FOR PLANTS AND GARDENS INCLUDING SEEDS, MULCH, FERTILIZER, SOIL, GARDENING TOOLS, AND POTS, BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE A HARDWARE STORE, A HOME CENTER, OR A BUILDING SUPPLY STORE.

TITLE 3. PARKING, NONRESIDENTIAL, OUTDOOR LIGHTING AND SIGNAGE

18-3-104. Parking space requirements.

The minimum onsite required parking spaces are listed in the chart below. They may be increased based on site development plan review or special exception approval, reduced as provided in § 18-3-105, or superseded by a parking program allowed by this Code. The Planning and Zoning Officer may determine reasonable and appropriate onsite parking requirements for structures and land uses that are not listed on the chart based on requirements for similar uses, comments from reviewing agencies, and the parking needs of the proposed use.

TITLE 4. RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS

18-4-106. Permitted, conditional, and special exception uses.

The permitted, conditional, and special exception uses allowed in each of the residential districts are listed in the chart in this section using the following key: P = permitted use; C = conditional use; SE = special exception use. A blank means that the use is not allowed in the district. Except as provided otherwise in this article, uses and

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structures customarily accessory to the listed uses also are allowed, except that guest houses as accessory structures are prohibited and outside storage as an accessory use is limited to the lesser of 10% of the allowed lot coverage or 500 square feet.

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TITLE 10. REQUIREMENTS FOR CONDITIONAL USES

18-10-120. Garden Centers.

A GARDEN CENTER SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS.

- (1) THE FACILITY SHALL BE LOCATED ON A LOT THAT IS AT LEAST TWO ACRES BUT NOT MORE THAN FIVE ACRES.
 - (2) THE FACILITY SHALL BE LOCATED ON AN ARTERIAL ROAD.
- (3) ACCESSORY USES INCLUDE THE RAISING OR THE KEEPING OF CHICKENS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 18-4-104 OF THIS CODE, THE RAISING OR THE KEEPING OF BEES, AND THE SALE OF EGGS, HONEY, AND OTHER PRODUCTS RELATING TO CHICKENS AND BEES.

SECTION 3. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
