A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE concerning: Article 2 - Branches of County Government - Executive 1 2 and Judicial Branches 3 FOR the purpose of making certain technical and stylistic changes; adding the Office of 4 Emergency Management as an office in the Executive Branch; repealing provisions 5 relating to Core Groups; correcting the name of Constituent Services; adding the 6 Compliance Officer as a position assigned to the Executive Office; removing certain 7 obsolete positions from the Executive Office; requiring a baccalaureate degree for the 8 Superintendent of the Department of Detention Facilities; requiring the Director of 9 Public Works to be an engineering graduate of a college or university; removing a 10 requirement that the Director of Public Works' period of relevant work experience be 11 12 immediately prior to appointment; comporting the qualifications of the Health Officer to State law; adding advertising and interview provisions for filling a vacancy in the 13 position of Health Officer; clarifying that property taxes shall be paid on an entire 14 parcel even if only a portion of the parcel is being transferred; repealing a reserved 15 section; removing certain inaccurate language regarding successor agencies; 16 removing redundant language; and generally relating to the Branches of County 17 Government Article of the County Code. 18 19

There is an Executive Office in the Executive Branch that is responsible for administrative support to the County Executive, [Community and] Constituent Services [(as successor to the Office of Community Services and Information)], government relations, human relations, and public information.

2-1-301. Chief Administrative Officer.

(b) Officer. The Chief Administrative Officer is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the County Executive. The Chief Administrative Officer shall possess the qualifications required by the Charter and be appointed solely on the basis of the appointee's qualifications for performing the duties of the office. The Chief Administrative Officer has the authority, duties, responsibilities, and functions prescribed in the Charter and this Code, except the Chief Administrative Officer's supervisory authority over Executive Branch offices, departments, and units [outside the Administrative Core Group] is as the County Executive[,] from time to time[,] directs.

2-1-503. Aging and Disabilities.

The Director of the Department of Aging and Disabilities, after consultation with and written agreement from the Area Agency on Aging Advisory Council, may establish fees for [the] use of facilities and [the] participation in programs sponsored by the Department, but the Director shall provide 90 days' notice of any new fee or change in a fee by posting an appropriate notice in [each Department of Aging and Disabilities facility and] each location in which a Department of Aging and Disabilities program takes place.

2-1-504. Detention Facilities.

(a) **Qualifications.** The [qualifications of the] Superintendent of the Department of Detention Facilities SHALL HAVE:

(1) [include] a baccalaureate degree in an appropriate discipline[,];

(2) a minimum of five years of related experience[,]; and

(3) demonstrated administrative ability and leadership. [The baccalaureate degree requirement may be satisfied by the completion of a career development program that includes work-related experience, training, or college credits at a level of achievement equivalent to a bachelor's degree.]

(b) Duties. The authority, duties, and functions of the Superintendent include:

(1) operating detention facilities[, including the Jennifer Road Detention Center and the Ordnance Road Correctional Facility];

(2) maintaining public safety through [the] confinement and supervision of offenders;

(3) developing and managing the Department's operating budget;

(4) providing employee services; and

(5) implementing regulatory requirements and standards.

2-1-505. Public Works.

The Director of Public Works shall:

(1) be an engineering graduate of a college or university of recognized standing and a registered professional engineer of demonstrated ability in [the] management of public works; [or] AND

(2) [have an equivalent combination of acceptable education and experience; and

(3) have had responsible charge of engineering works over a period of at least five years [immediately prior to appointment].

2-1-603. Health.

(a) **Establishment.** There is a Department of Health as provided in the Charter.

(b) Vacancy.

(1) Within 60 days after the occurrence of a vacancy, the County Executive shall submit by resolution to the County Council the name of an individual MEETING THE QUALIFICATIONS OF § 3-302 OF THE HEALTH-GENERAL ARTICLE OF THE STATE CODE to be nominated as Health Officer.

(2) TO IDENTIFY A NOMINEE, THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE SHALL ADVERTISE THE VACANCY IN A MANNER DETERMINED IN THE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND SHALL INTERVIEW THOSE APPLICANTS WHO, IN THE SOLE JUDGMENT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE, MEET THE QUALIFICATIONS SET FORTH IN § 3 302 OF THE HEALTH GENERAL ARTICLE OF THE STATE CODE AND, IF APPOINTED, WOULD SERVE THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE COUNTY PERSONNEL OFFICER SHALL ADVERTISE THE VACANCY AND INCLUDE THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR A HEALTH OFFICER LISTED IN § 3-302 OF THE HEALTH-GENERAL ARTICLE OF THE STATE CODE. THE PERSONNEL OFFICER SHALL REPORT TO THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND THE COUNTY COUNCIL THE STEPS TAKEN TO PUBLICLY ADVERTISE THE VACANCY AND RECRUIT QUALIFIED CANDIDATES FOR HEALTH OFFICER.

(c) [Qualifications. The nominee for a vacancy shall have:

(1) a master's degree in public health and at least two years' work in the field of public health; or

(2) at least five years' work in the field of public health; and

(3) any other qualifications and training in the field of public health required by State rule or regulation.

(d) **Nominee not a physician.** If the nominee is not a physician, as defined in § 1-101 OF the Health-General Article[, § 1-101,] of the State Code, the Health Officer shall have a deputy who:

1	(1) is a physician, as defined in $\S 1-101$ OF the Health-General Article, $\S 1-101$,
2	of the State Code; and

6	(e)] Referral to State. On approval of the County Council, the name of the nominee
7	shall be sent to the Secretary of the State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for
8	appointment as Health Officer.

12	2-3-102. Conveyances of part of subdivision.
13	
14	[(a) Lots in single tax account.] Whenever [a tract of land or a number of lots in a
15	subdivision appear] PROPERTY APPEARS on the Controller's tax roll as a single account
16	and the person to whom the property is assessed executes a conveyance of less than the
17	entire property shown on the account, the Controller may not certify the deed for transfer
18	unless the [entire] taxes due on [that part] THE ENTIRE PROPERTY are paid.
19	
20	[(b) Blocks in single tax account. Whenever one or more whole blocks or sections of
21	a subdivision appear on the Controller's tax roll as a single account and the person to
22	whom the property is assessed executes a conveyance of one or more lots out of the
23	subdivision, the Controller may not certify the deed for transfer unless taxes are paid for
24	the entire block or section of which the lots being conveyed are a part.]

26	[2-3-105.] 2-3-104. Additional marriage license fee.
27	
28	In addition to the marriage license fee of \$10 required by § 2-404(A) OF the Family
29	Law Article[, § 2-404(a),] of the State Code, the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Anne
30	Arundel County shall charge a fee of \$45 for each marriage license issued by the Clerk.
31	The proceeds of the additional fee shall be paid monthly to the Controller.

33	SECTION 4. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45
34	days from the date it becomes law.
