17	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County,
18	Maryland, That § 8-3-209 of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) is
19	hereby renumbered to be § 8-3-210.

24	ARTICLE 8. PURCHASING

TITLE 3. ACQUISITION, DISPOSITION, AND LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY

8-3-202. Disposition of surplus property – In general.

(a) Generally. Except for real property that is to be disposed of for purposes consistent with those for which it was originally acquired OR FOR PROPERTY DISPOSED OF PURSUANT TO § 8-3-209, the County may not dispose of real property owned by it unless the County Executive, with the approval of the County Council by resolution, has determined that the real property is surplus property. In determining whether property is surplus property, and in addition to other procedures that the County Executive considers appropriate, the County Executive shall inquire whether any office, department, or agency of the County has a present need, or reasonably anticipates a future need, for the

8-3-209. Disposition of fee simple title to real property to governmental entities.

(A) **Generally.** UPON REQUEST OF AN AGENCY OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, AN AGENCY OF A STATE GOVERNMENT, A QUASI-GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, OR A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, THE COUNTY MAY TRANSFER FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO REAL PROPERTY FOR WHICH IT HAS NO IDENTIFIED PRESENT OR FUTURE NEED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

(B) Procedure for disposition.

(1) UPON RECEIPT OF A REQUEST FROM AN ENTITY DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (A) FOR FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO REAL PROPERTY, THE CENTRAL SERVICES OFFICER SHALL INQUIRE AS TO WHETHER ANY COUNTY OFFICE, DEPARTMENT, OR AGENCY HAS A PRESENT NEED OR REASONABLY ANTICIPATES A FUTURE NEED FOR THE PROPERTY.

(2) IF NO SUCH NEED IS IDENTIFIED, THE CENTRAL SERVICES OFFICER SHALL RECOMMEND TO THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE THAT FEE SIMPLE TITLE BE TRANSFERRED TO THE REQUESTING ENTITY.

(3) IF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE APPROVES THE TRANSFER OF FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO THE REAL PROPERTY TO THE REQUESTING ENTITY, THE CENTRAL SERVICES OFFICER SHALL DETERMINE THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THE REAL PROPERTY BY REVIEWING ONE APPRAISAL IF THE ASSESSED VALUE IS OVER \$1,000.

(4) (I) IF THE CONSIDERATION FOR THE TRANSFER OF FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO THE REAL PROPERTY IS EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN 75% OF THE APPRAISED VALUE, OR THE ASSESSED VALUE IS \$1,000 OR LESS, FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO THE REAL PROPERTY MAY BE TRANSFERRED TO THE REQUESTING ENTITY WITHOUT FURTHER APPROVALS.

(II) IF THE ASSESSED VALUE IS GREATER THAN \$1,000 AND CONSIDERATION FOR THE REAL PROPERTY IS LESS THAN 75% OF THE APPRAISED VALUE, FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO THE REAL PROPERTY MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED TO THE REQUESTING ENTITY WITHOUT APPROVAL OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL BY RESOLUTION.

SECTION 3. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
