Resolution No. 62-16

1	RESOLUTION urging County Executive Steven R. Schuh and Superintendent Terry
2	Kokolis of the Department of Detention Facilities to decline to enter into any upon
3	execution of an agreement with the federal government for the purpose of housing
4	individuals undergoing civil immigration proceedings at any Anne Arundel County
5	Correctional Facility to make personnel changes or increases in budget items related to
6	the agreement and changes at the Facility part of the annual County budget process.

8	WHEREAS, it is not in the interests of Anne Arundel County residents to
9	entangle County resources with the federal immigration system; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, it should not be the policy of Anne Arundel County to implement the
12	detention of human beings as a business profit center; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, in recent budget cycles, the Department of Detention Facilities has
15	consistently reported a lack of necessary staffing, with staff numbers remaining
16	below their budget requests, requiring the Department to consider supplementing
17	personnel with private security company staff; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, County internal policies should not have to be changed to
20	accommodate federal detention policies; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, entering into an agreement with the federal government to house
23	individuals going through immigration enforcement proceedings may obligate the
24	County regarding other special demands or limits; and

26	WHEREAS, Anne Arundel County residents expect transparency in the use of all
27	County resources through the County Council budget process and in the execution
28	of agreements utilizing County facilities and resources; and

30	WHEREAS, the Anne Arundel County Council is the final fiscal authority and
31	acts as a fiscal steward of scarce resources, and any an agreement with federal
32	immigration authorities represents may create an unexpected demand on those
33	resources, both directly through use of and enhancement of facilities to meet
34	certain standards as well as the costs of likely litigation resulting from

enforcement activities related to the agreement; and

WHEREAS, any agreement that provides financial incentive to local law enforcement to detain suspected individuals could have a damaging effect on trust of law enforcement in Anne Arundel communities; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, that it opposes any proposed agreement with the United States Department of Homeland Security that allows for the use of County resources, including detention facilities, for the purpose of detaining individuals awaiting civil immigration proceedings or related immigration enforcement activities and urges the County Executive and the Detention Facilities Superintendent to decline to enter into any agreement with the United States Government for these purposes; and be it further

Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, that the County Council urges the County Executive to make all changes related to personnel and budget items related to the execution of an agreement with the United States Department of Homeland Security for detention of individuals awaiting civil immigration proceedings part of the annual County Budget process as a means of ensuring transparent, efficient and legal use of County resources.

 Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be delivered to County Executive Steven R. Schuh, Superintendent Terry Kokolis of the Department of Detention Facilities, and all members of the Maryland Congressional Delegation.
