RESOLUTION requesting the County Executive to enter into an agreement with th U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement on behalf of Anne Arundel County to perform certain immigration enforcement functions pursuant to Section 287(g) of the Immigration and Nationality Act
WHEREAS, Section 287(g) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, codified at 8 U.S.C. § 1357(g), allows, among other things, a political subdivision of a state to become qualified to perform certain functions of federal immigration officers during the investigation, apprehension, or detention of criminal aliens within its jails and correctional facilities; and
WHEREAS, on June 19, 2017, Anne Arundel County and the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, a component of the Department of Homeland Security, ("ICE") entered into a Memorandum of Agreement under Section 287(g) (the "MOA") to authorize County detention officers who complete ICE training to identify and process for removal, criminal aliens detained in County jails and correctional facilities who fall within ICE's civil immigration enforcement priorities; and
WHEREAS, a Section 287(g) program became operational in the County on December 20, 2017 after detention officers completed training and ICE equipment was installed at the Jennifer Road Detention Center; and
WHEREAS, since the 2017 launch of the program, 193 foreign-born individuals detained as a result of allegedly committing a crime have been questioned about their immigration status while being processed by County detention officers; and
WHEREAS, 69 of these foreign-born individuals were found to have either overstayed their visas or entered the country without documentation and, of those 69 individuals, approximately half of the charged offenses were classified as violent offenses, including the crimes of assault and murder; and
WHEREAS, not one individual was turned over to ICE custody until the crime for which they were arrested was adjudicated, no matter the crime; and

WHEREAS, on December 4, 2018, the County informally ceased participation in

WHEREAS, on December 27, 2018 the County Executive issued a 'Report on the Impacts of the Federal 287g Program and ICE Detention Center in Anne Arundel County' (the "Report"); and

WHEREAS, despite the fact that the Report did not describe any instances of abuse, mistreatment, or misapplication of Section 287(g) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, the County Executive, pursuant to Section XXI of the MOA, ceased participation in the MOA and the 287(g) Program on December 27, 2018; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That it hereby requests that the County Executive, on behalf of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, immediately undertake actions to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to perform certain immigration enforcement functions pursuant to Section 287(g) of the Immigration and Nationality Act; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to County Executive Steuart Pittman; County Chief of Police Timothy Altomare; and the County Superintendent of Detention Facilities.
