1	RESOLUTION supporting the mission of the Equal Justice Initiative and remembering
2	the victims of lynching in Anne Arundel County
3	WHIPPEAG A G A G A G A Thomas And a set to set to get a CA - E and Lordina
4	WHEREAS, the County Council supports the nationwide effort of the Equal Justice
5	Initiative, specifically, in acknowledging and condemning the lynching of
6	thousands of victims; and
7 8	WHEREAS, for many residents in Anne Arundel County, the history of lynching
9	is the history of their family and community; and
10	is the history of their failing and community, and
11	WHEREAS, at least five lynchings took place in Anne Arundel County between
12	the Civil War and World War II – John Simms in 1875, George Briscoe in 1884,
13	Wright Smith in 1898, Henry Davis in 1906, and King Johnson in 1911; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, Henry Davis, who was lynched in Annapolis on a bluff near College
16	Creek just days before Christmas in 1906, was never given any opportunity to
17	confront his accuser nor defend himself against the accusations made towards him;

20	WHEREAS, there is no known census record for Mr. Davis and his age and home
21	address at the time of his death are uncertain; and
22	WHEREAS, despite the inevitable presence of many eyewitnesses to the lynching
23	of Henry Davis, and a month long investigation, a judge and jury were unable to
24 25	charge a single person in connection with Henry Davis' death; and
26	charge a single person in connection with from y Davis acati, and
27	WHEREAS, it is important to bring awareness of this traumatic history in order to
28	foster community dialogue and to forge bonds of empathy and community healing
29	through the recognition and memorialization of these horrific lynchings; and

31	WHEREAS, the County Council supports the nationwide effort of the Equal Justice
32	Initiative in acknowledging and condemning the lynching of thousands of victims;

35	WHEREAS, the County Council supports the sentiment of the Equal Justice
36	Initiative that a history of racial injustice must be acknowledged and mass atrocities

and abuse must be recognized and remembered before a community can recover; now, therefore, be it
