New Pedestrian Signal

Things to Remember

Drivers and Cyclists on the roadway

- **ANTICIPATE** people crossing whenever you see a crosswalk and **SLOW** down.
- **LOOK** for the red signal.
- **STOP** for pedestrians in the crosswalk even if the red signal is not on.
- **STOP** your vehicle at the stop line.
- **WAIT** for flashing yellow signal before proceeding.

Pedestrians and Cyclists using the crosswalk

- Before crossing, whether biking or walking, press the “walk” button to activate overhead beacons to alert and stop drivers.
- The signal flashes yellow, then changes to solid yellow, then to solid red.
- Carefully look and make sure vehicles are stopped. Use the crosswalk.
- Remember to wait for the “walk” symbol before crossing.
- Be cautious – although drivers should stop for pedestrians and red lights, not all do.
- Stay alert. Avoid distractions, including mobile phone use.
- Stay visible with reflective and light-colored clothing. Use a light when biking at night and during inclement weather.
