III. Purpose:

To implement, manage and evaluate a comprehensive sanitation, environmental health and safety program inclusive of, but not limited to, emergency plans, disturbance plans, hazardous materials, Right-to-Know Program and bloodborne pathogens to ensure compliance with federal and state standards to protect the general health of employees, contractors,

incarcerated individuals and the general public.

IV. Policy:

A. It shall be the policy of the AACDDF to develop and implement policies that align with the Department's Environmental Health Program.

B. The AACDDF Accreditation Coordinator shall be responsible for collecting data related to the facility wide Environmental Health Program.

V. Procedure:

- A. Employees and contractors shall receive education on all aspects of the Department's Environmental Health Program through approved training provided by the AACDDF's Training Unit.
