Dear Chair Pickard and Members of the County Council:

In May 2021, Anne Arundel County received notice that it would receive \$112,509,414 in funds from the United States Treasury provided through the American Recovery Plan Act. The County received the first installment payment of \$56,254,707 on May 19, 2021 and the second and final installment in the same amount on June 6, 2022.

The County Council passed Bill No. 111-21 and Bill No. 112-21 effective as of February 27, 2022. These bills require the Administration to keep the Council apprised of additional uses of these same funds beyond those planned in the annual budget ordinance. The bills also require that the Controller provide reports by the 20th day of each month describing all approvals and expenditures of projects awarded these funds. Both bills require the Controller to provide a final report on January 31, 2027.

This is the required financial report for the month ended September 30, 2024. Through that date, the County Administration has authorized 139 projects to begin spending up to \$113,202,935.32 of American Recovery Plan Act funding. Related spending through September 30, 2024 was \$88,890,158.99 and a further \$322,350.24 is encumbered to be spent. A summary of these projects and their spending is included with this letter. Beginning with this month's report, the summary will also reflect the remaining revenue loss adjustment.

Additionally, I have included a memo prepared by the Office of Budget related to one project added in September. The memo provides additional information about the scope of the new project that I hope you will find useful. The memos for projects approved in earlier months were included with previous monthly reports.

In future monthly reports, I will provide you with an update of the amounts spent and encumbered for all projects, including any new projects authorized. Those monthly reports will also provide you with additional memos for any new projects. If you have any questions about this report or the included summary, please let me know.
